God willing, the new plants and substrate should all arrive beginning of April. The delivery of products to customers continues as harvest has decreased. We have also added the frozen popsicles to our product list which the customers have been ordering and enjoying.

Twalima Farm & Nursery: At Twalima Farm, the planting and harvest of crops continues. Anton and Ali are leading the efforts as we grow onions, cabbage, lettuce, etc. In addition to the crops growing at Twalima Farm, we have been able to add local products to our product list for sales in the Congo. These currently include carrots, cucumbers, tomatoes, peppers and



passion fruit. These other products has supported our revenue numbers during a slower harvest time at the farms, as well as provide great customer service opportunity to our customers in the Congo that have requested additional products. We are thankful for this opportunity.



Lifesong Farms Business Office: This month we have kicked-off the Lifesong Vision business venture, while Vim and his mom Vicki, were visiting. Our former Lifesong student Eshelly, and a former Northrise student, Jack, are doing the sales for Lifesong Vision.
