Term 2 Closing and Holiday Activities:

second term concluded with dvnamic celebrations, where 1,500 students showcased their talents and received awards recognizing their academic and extracurricular achievements. As part of the term-end activities, a two-week exam remediation program was conducted for 196 students in key exam grades (Grade 7s, 9s, and 12s) to strengthen their exam readiness. During this period, discipleship program, was well-coordinated by a dedicated team of shepherds, that played a key role in fostering a positive environment. Students also had time of engaging in various sporting discipline and other activities, which contributed to their holistic development.

Unity High School Construction Project: The construction of Unity High School made significant strides in August, with experts from Zambia, USA, and Canada leading the foundational work. The new High school with boarding facility project will serve over 1,000 students and create more than 100 employment opportunities, aligning with our vision of "Discipling future leaders through biblical truth and Educational excellence".

Gap-Year Program: Forty-eight Gap-Year students were oriented for outreach missions in partnership with Operation Mobilization (OM). These students have been commissioned for 3 Months (September to Month end November, 2024) to remote districts across Zambia. The locations are Ndola, Kabwe, Kasama, Mkushi, Chipata, Chongwe, and Sesheke. They have been equipped with the Christ Mission and essential resources to support their work in these communities, focusing on transforming lives through spiritual and community engagement.

Discipleship Program: The second term holiday CPDs started from August 12th to 26th, seven school leaders from Chipata, Garneton, and Kawama participated in a leadership development program focused on Christ-centered servant leadership. This training aimed to equip school leaders with the skills necessary to guide our schools with integrity and spiritual purpose. In addition, over 85 teachers across all Lifesong schools participated in in-house CPD and Stimulation Skills workshops. These workshops provided innovative strategies to improve teaching skills and foster cognitive development, contributing to enhanced learning outcomes.

VOTEC Program Developments: The VOTEC program, saw continued success with the introduction of two new courses - Auto Mechanics and Power Electrical. Students who took exams in Food Production, Brick Laying, and Tailoring Designing in 2023 achieved impressive pass rates. Term 2 –2024, the enrolment has increased. This is part of the indicator of demand for vocational courses among students and reflects the growing recognition of the program's value in providing practical, job-ready skills.
