Health Services Update: Health — one of the core pledges of Lifesong — saw significant progress this month. We are pleased to announce that our Garneton Clinic is now officially registered with the Ministry of Health in Zambia. This milestone marks a major step forward, as both our clinics are now fully recognized and authorized to operate, enabling us to provide excellent and unrestricted health services.

Our clinics, which serve over 600 individuals — including students, staff, interns, and personnel from universities, colleges, and nearby businesses — continue to im-prove in quality and efficiency. **Led by Dr. Mingochi as our overall medical personnel**, the clinics benefit from strong leadership and a team of qualified, dedicated healthcare professionals who are making a tangible impact on patient care and service delivery.

International Women's Day – 08/03/25: Over 150 women came together in joy and reflection to celebrate International Women's Day at Lifesong. It was a powerful and meaningful time of encouragement, appreciation, and recognition of the incredible passion our women bring to the Lifesong vision of serving orphans and vulnerable children.





The event was filled with color and culture, as the women proudly wore their beautiful African chitenge attire, symbolizing unity, identity, and strength. Their vibrant presence and shared stories inspired many, reminding us all of the vital role they play in shaping lives and communities.

Youth Day – 12/04/2025: On the same day, over 90 Lifesong youths joined others under the Chaplaincy to participate in Youth Day for Children, held in partnership with Faith Baptist Church.
