

## LIFESONG FOR ORPHANS – ZAMBIA, ACADEMIC REPORT FOR MARCH, 2026

### March—Month of Grief

March was a difficult month for our **Lifesong for Orphans-Zambia**. We sadly lost one of our **Pre-K learners**, by the name of **Success Nambo**, on 12th March, 2026, who passed away in a traffic accident while at home during a public holiday. This loss deeply affected students, staff, and families across all six schools. Many children and staff asked honest and heartfelt questions about why such a young life was taken so soon.



### Academic Progress and Assessments

Despite the challenges, learning continued with focus and consistency. All schools remained committed to delivering quality education through the **New Competence-Based Curriculum (CBC)**. Even our youngest learners (from age four) participated in simple assessments that help measure understanding and skills development.

Classroom learning included practical activities, allowing students to engage actively and apply what they learn. Teachers also prepared students well for the end-of-term examinations, ensuring readiness and confidence.

### Spiritual Formation and Stewardship

Spiritual growth remains central in our schools. During March, stewardship training was taught in classrooms and assemblies. Students learned how to manage their time, talents, and resources in ways that honor God. These lessons focused on being faithful in small responsibilities, living with integrity, and understanding accountability. This continues to shape strong character alongside academic learning.

### Gap Year Practical Training (Taveta Program)

The Gap Year program of 56 student continued to run well, especially in the Taveta practical placements. Students were placed in different centers and businesses, where they continue gaining hands-on experience.

This exposure helps students connect what they have learned in school with real-life work environments, preparing them for future careers and responsibilities.

### Farm Discipleship Program



The farm discipleship program remained a key area of growth. Over 350 Students in high school participated in practical agricultural work while learning biblical values such as diligence, responsibility, and faithfulness.

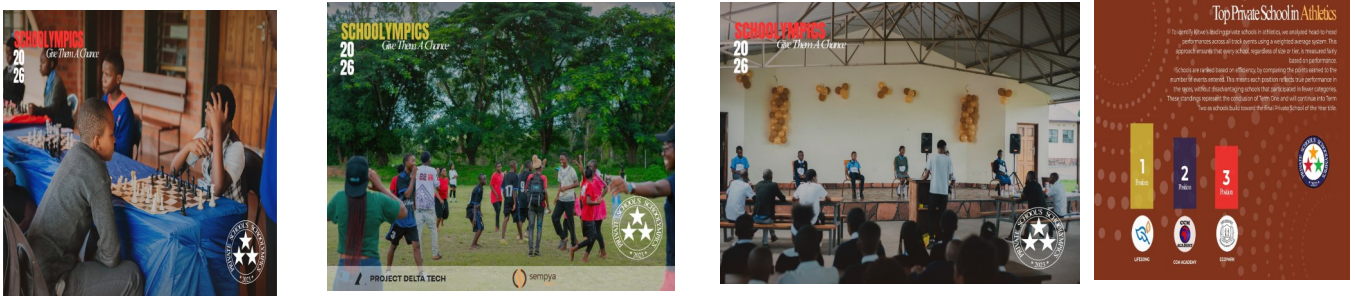
This program continues to be an effective way to build life skills while encouraging spiritual maturity in everyday tasks.
